Fees

Tuition fees are due and payable at time of registration (by calling 717-7755). The cost of each class is stated with the information about that offering. Fees vary in accordance with the number of sessions of a class and the anticipated enrollment. Holistic Veterinary Care: Young Pets

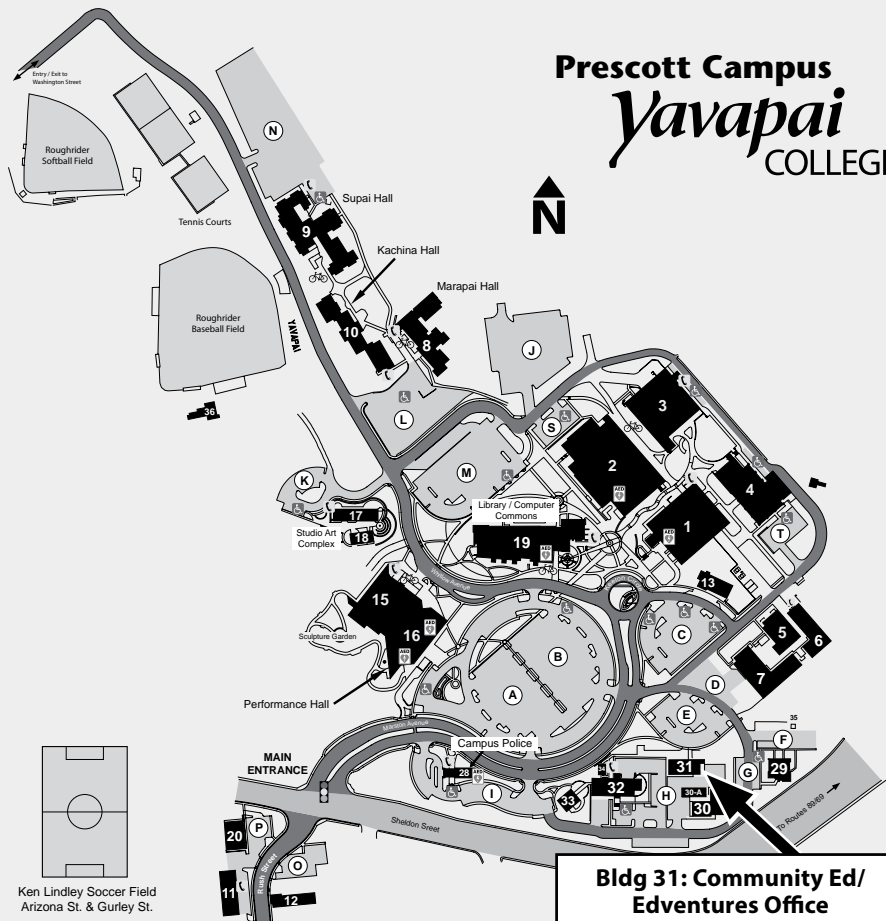
