SUPPLIES (Bring the supplies you normally use for drawing, but, please *Check it against* this list to see if you may need or want to add some things)

Paper:

a cheap sketch pad...or newsprint 9X12 is a good size a pad of 100 lb Bristol (9x12 is a good portrait size) a pad of Strathmore toned grey or grey scale paper (8x10 or 9 x 12)

Support

Piece of gatorboard, or masonite, a smooth, hard surface ...large enough to support the size paper on which you will be drawing. About 16 x 20 is a good size.

Miscellaneous Items:

- o Several regular number 2 yellow pencils
- o Small set of B drawing pencils
- o Small set of charcoals (light, medium, dark) if you want to work in charcoal
- Small box of vine charcoal
- One sheet of clear plexiglass (8"x10" or 9"x12") Purchase at Home Depot or Sarasota Art and Frame in the frame dept.
- One black permanent marker (sharpie)
- o And erasable (non-permanent) black felt tip marker
- Masking tape
- o A small hand held sharpener
- o One Kneaded Eraser (Gray in color and flat.), one pink pearl or white eraser, one barrel eraser
- o A Piece of chamois
- Tortillions (or blending stubs)
- o Roll of paper towels
- o Exacto knife

Optional:

Electric eraser

A Proportional Divider (get an inexpensive one .that costs less than \$15)
